This presentation describes how incarcerated women and girls use guided memoir writing to connect with their pasts and begin to dream of beginning new chapters in their lives, as they dare audiences in prison and out to care about what has happened to them.

Meet Herstory facilitators who have worked with nearly a thousand imprisoned women and girls over a seven-year period, and listen to readings by women whose lives have been transformed by the writing process they engaged in while serving time.

Meet the corrections officers who found such a change inside themselves that they asked if VOICES, Herstory Writers Workshop’s publication of prison writings could be included in the mandatory training of all future Suffolk County corrections officers as part of their requirement to graduate from the academy.

Founded in 1996, Herstory Writers Workshop provides opportunities through guided memoir writing that empower women from all walks of life (regardless of age, race, religion, financial status or sexual orientation, whether incarcerated or free) to turn their intimate stories into works of art crafted so that others can hear.
